Not Familiar with Flickr™?

Flickr is an online photo-sharing website that is made up of many groups, including a Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy group. You can add your photos to the Parks Conservancy photo-sharing group and quickly enter many images for others to see.

Submit Your Photos using Flickr™

To add a photo to Flickr™, just follow these easy steps:

1. **Log on**—To submit your photos via Flickr™, use your Yahoo!® ID to login to [Flickr](#)™. If you do not have an account, you can sign up for free. *(Please note: If your account is new, you'll need to upload at least 5 photos before you'll be able to see your images on Flickr™. After that minimum has been reached, it shouldn't take more than a few days for your photos to appear in searches, groups, etc.)*
2. **Upload an image**—After logging in, upload your images.
3. **Join the Parks Conservancy's Flickr group**—If you are not already a member of the Parks Conservancy's group on Flickr™, [join by clicking "Join?" on the group's homepage](#).
4. **Send the image to our group**—Browse to the image you wish to submit for the call for photos, click on the "Actions" drop-down menu above the image and select "add to/remove from group" to add your photograph to the Golden Gate National Parks Conservancy's photo pool.
5. **Tag it!**—Once you've added your photo to the group, tag each photo with *GGNPC11* through the "Tags" feature in the right-hand column of the individual photo's page.

That's it! You'll be helping us showcase the natural and cultural beauty of the Golden Gate National Parks for the sake of preserving your treasured parklands!
