





HOW TO DRAW A

Is it easy to draw a bobcat? FURR sure!


Follow these step-by-step instructions to learn how draw one of our favorite feline friends in the park. (We're PAW-sitive you can do it!)




1. Large circles give us the basic shape of our bobcat's body. Draw these parts lightly in pencil, so we can erase them later.




2. Now lightly draw these lines and circles for the legs.




3. Connect the circles as shown. Give your bobcat some tufts of fur.




4. Add these lines to make the bobcat's legs.




5. Now for a face! Start by adding these basic shapes.



6. Let's add a few more! Tufts on the side of his face will make your bobcat look furry.




7. Now erase the light sketches we made in steps 1 and 2.



8. Some final important details will make your bobcat come to life: cat eyes, a short tail, and a mix of stripes and spots.

SALMON SWIM




Happy birthday, baby salmon!

Scientists love to study snowy plovers, but they can be hard to spot—if a plover is sitting still in the sand dunes, their pale brown feathers make them almost invisible.



Example: the otter played.


